- <u>services.</u>

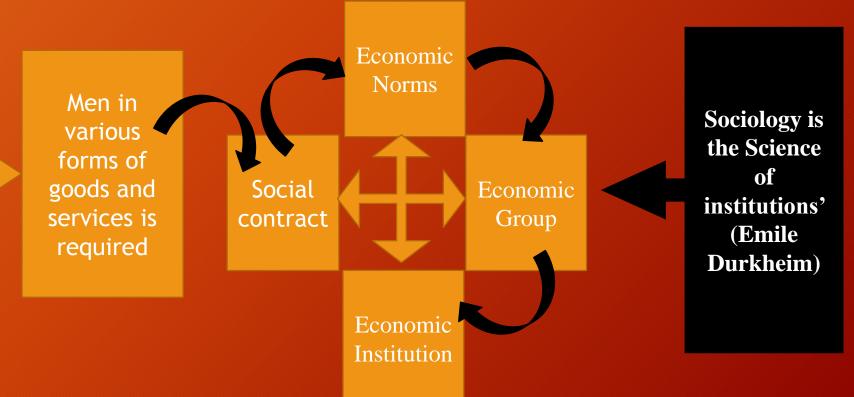
While dealing these economical functions in various form people interact with each other

5.	It is young science.	5.	It is an age-old.

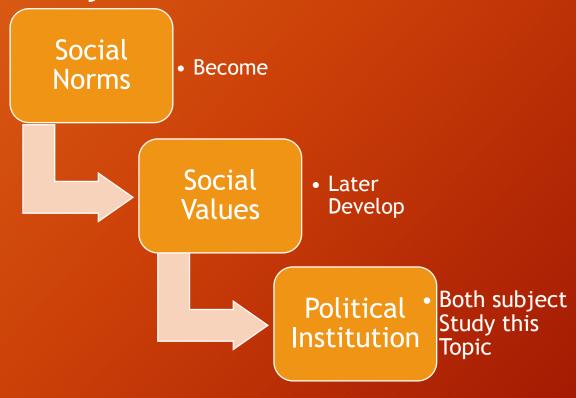

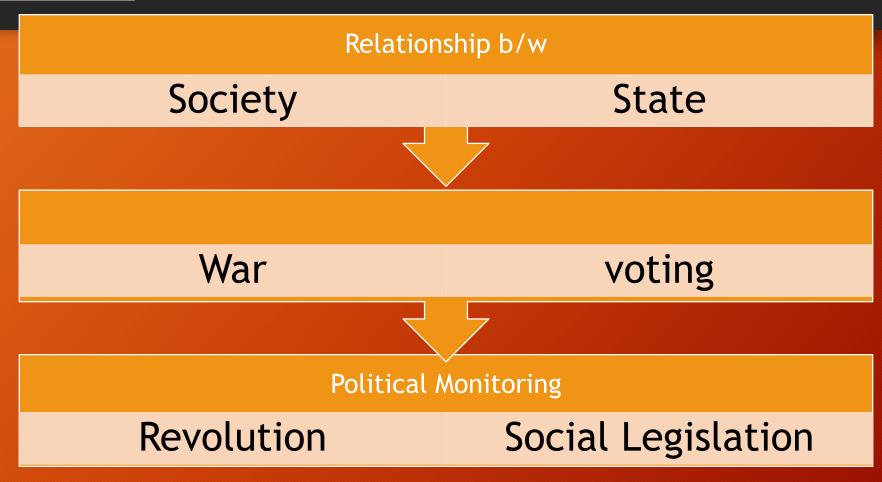

1.	Sociology is interested in the study of the <i>present</i> social phenomena with all their complexity.		
2.	Sociology is relatively a young social science. It has a very short history of its own. It is not even two centuries old.	2. History is an age-old social science. It has a long story of 2000 years or even more.	
3.	Sociology is an analytical science.	3. History is a descriptive science.	
4.	Sociology is abstract in nature. It studies mostly regular, the recurrent and the	4. History is concrete. The historian is interested in the unique, the particular	

#### Sociology and History <u>Differences:</u>

universal. For example, the sociologist does not study all the wars or battles waged by the mankind. But interested in war itself as a social phenomenon, as one kind of conflict between two groups.

- 5. Sociology is a generalizing science.
  Sociology seeks to establish generalizations after a careful study of the social phenomena.
- 6. Sociology follows the sociological approach. It studies human events from the sociological point of view, i.e., from the view point of social relationships involved.

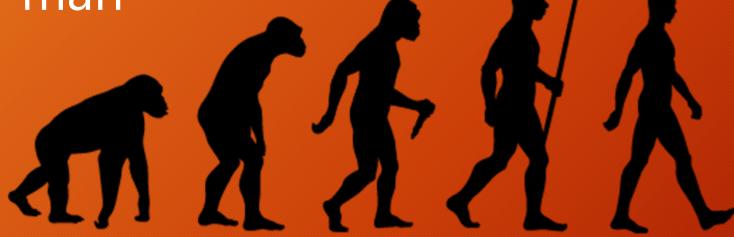
- and the individual. For example, the historian studies all the wars waged by mankind in the past-the Wars, the World Wars, the Indo-Pak War, etc. For him, each war is unique and significant.
- 5. History is an *individualizing science*. History rarely makes generalizations. It seeks to establish the sequence in which events occurred.
- History studies human events in accordance with the time order. Its approach is historical.

<ol> <li>Sociology studies society and social groups. It has no primary interest in the individual, not in his personality nor in his individual behavior.</li> </ol>	Social psychology analyses mental processes of man.	
2. Sociology analyses social processes.	<ol><li>Psychology and social psychology are primarily concerned with the behavior of individuals as such.</li></ol>	
<ol> <li>Sociology is interested in the social forms and structures within which the behavior of man takes place.</li> </ol>	<ol> <li>Psychology studies the individual and social psychology the individual in his social groups.</li> </ol>	
4. Sociology studies the groups themselves and the larger social structure within which both individual	<ol> <li>Social psychology studies the individual's behavior from the viewpoint of psychological factors</li> </ol>
